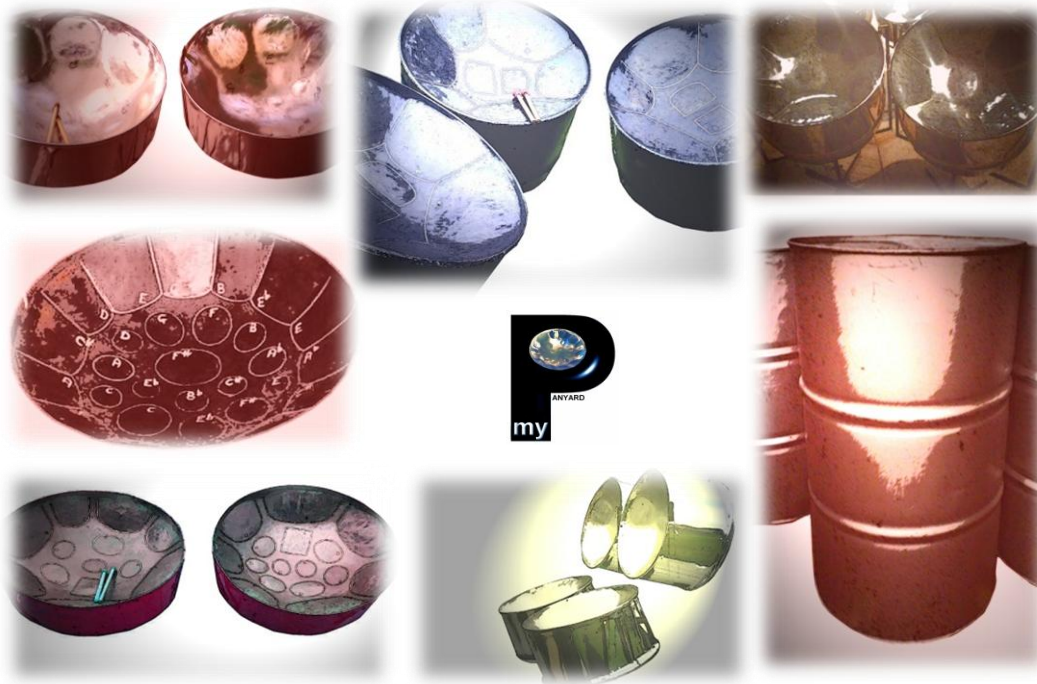


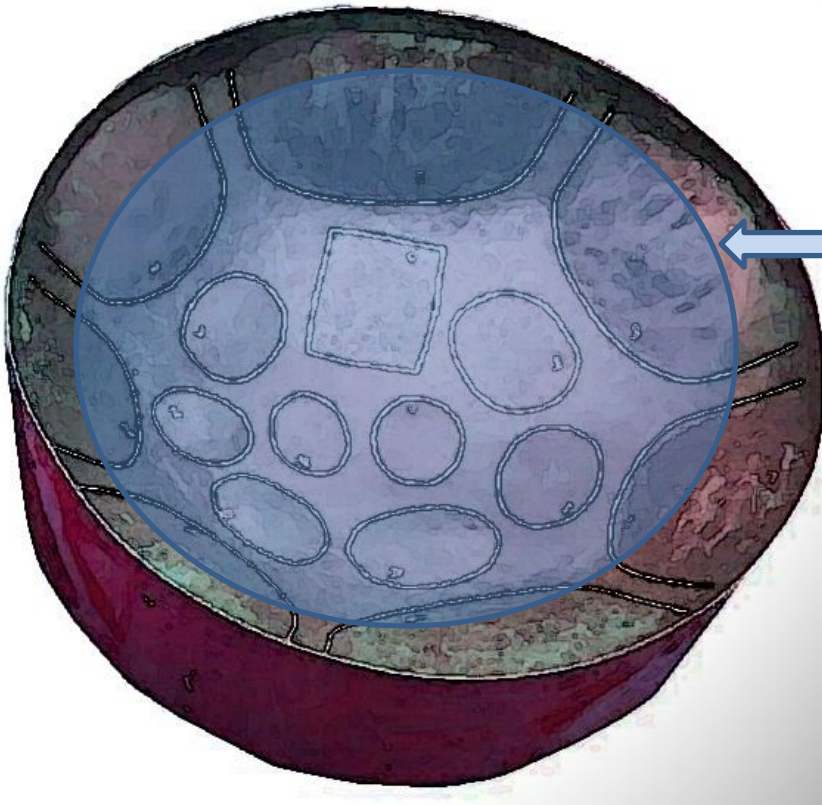
Pan Map

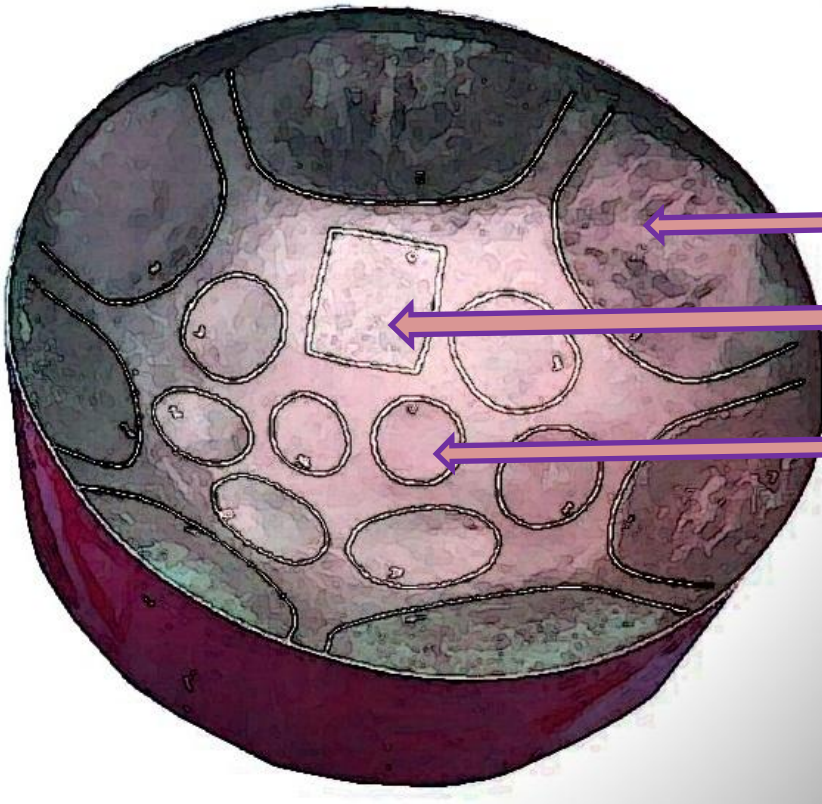


The playing surface is the main area of the pan where the notes are played.

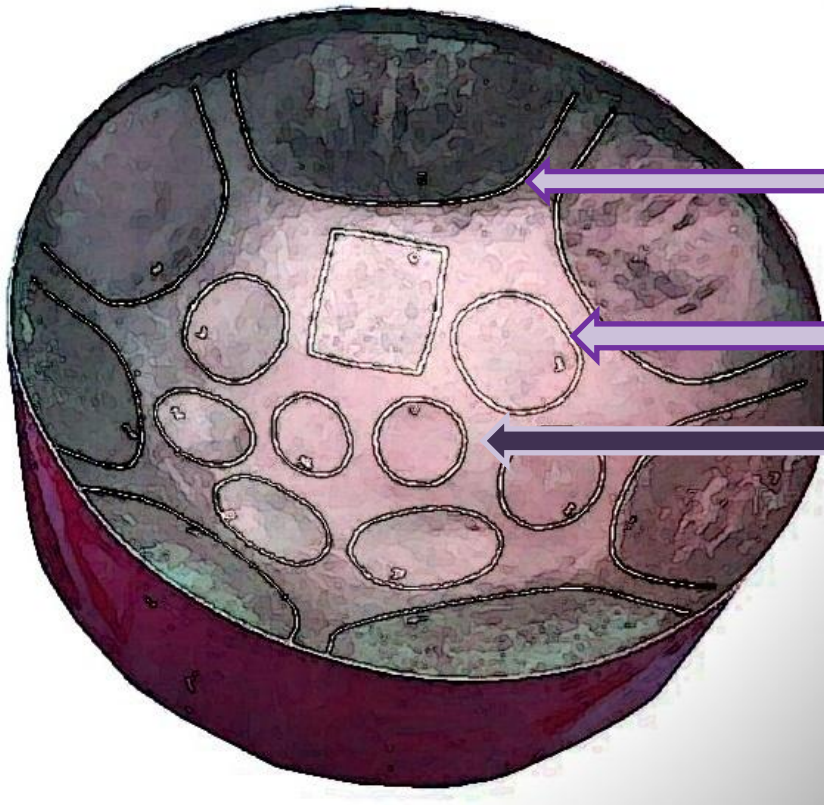
A note is a raised area on the playing surface.

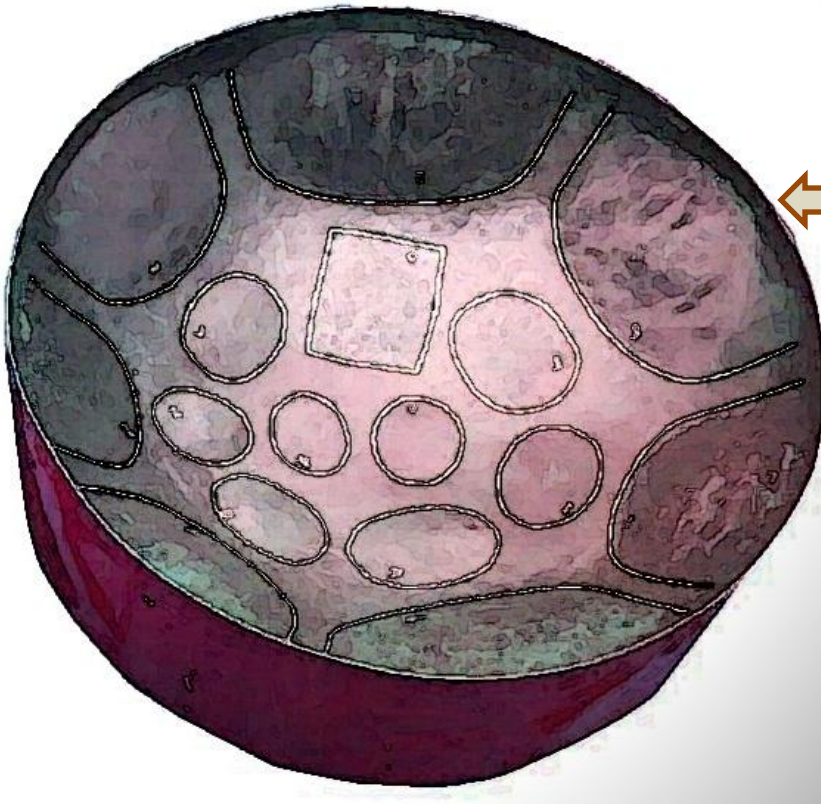
The grooves are the lines around the notes

Rim

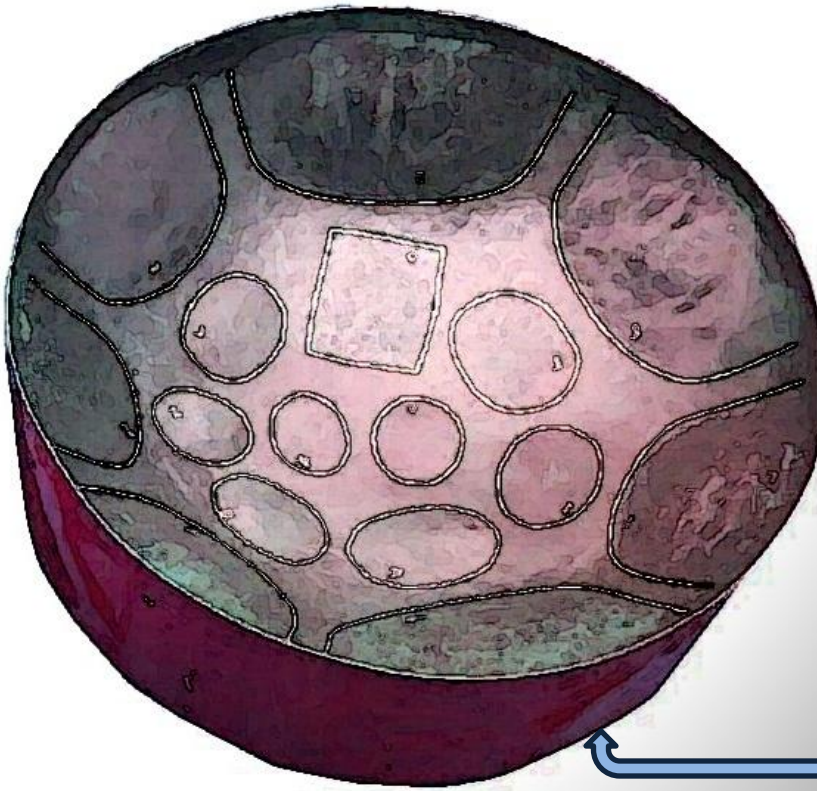
The rim is the edge around the playing surface

The playing surface and the skirt are joined at the rim.

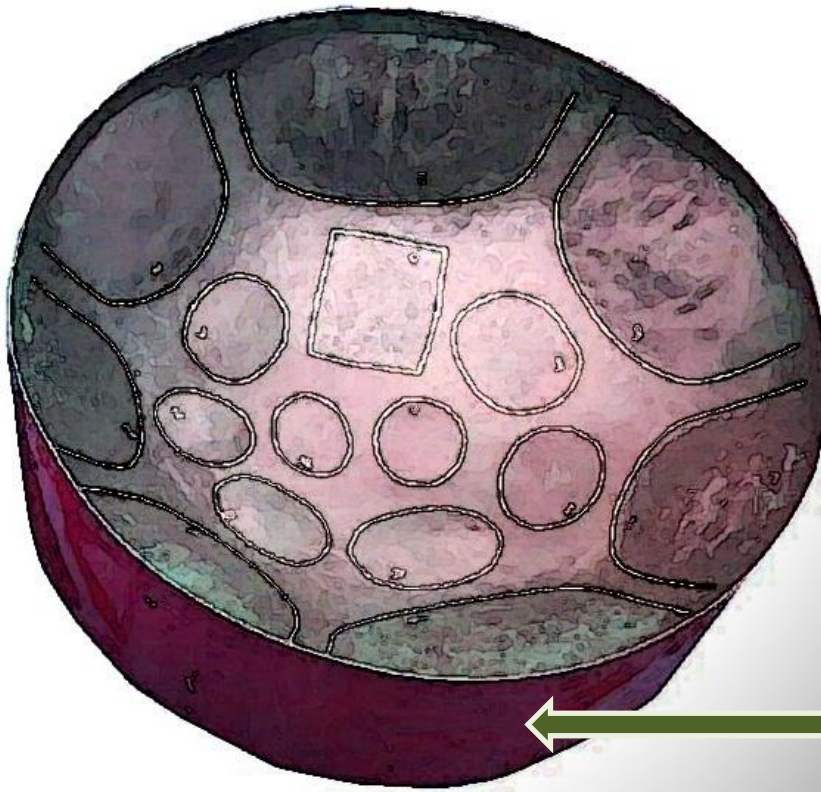


The edge is

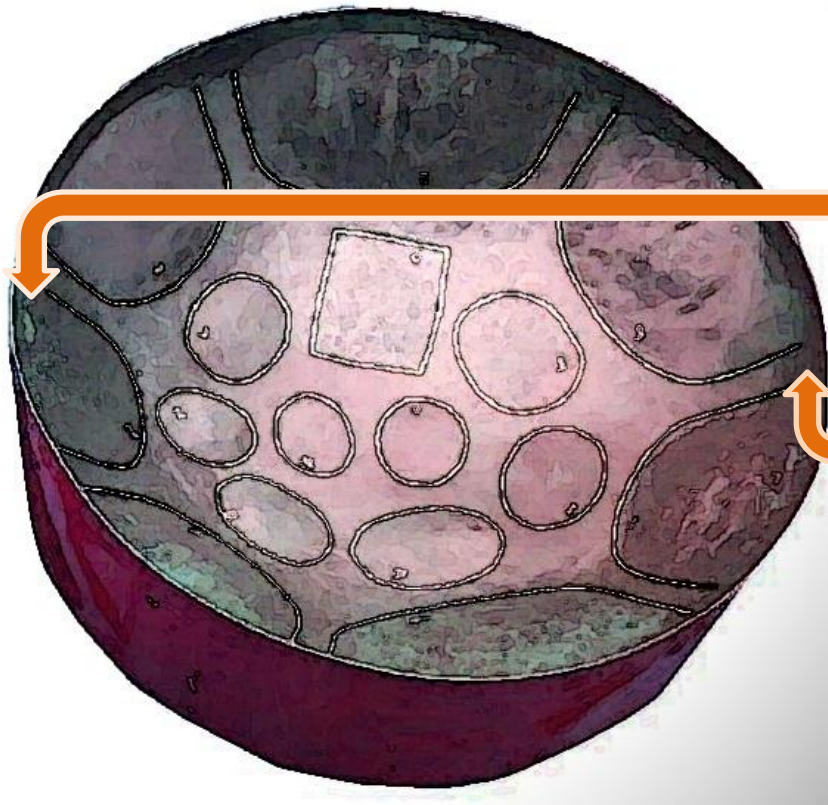


The skirt is the area between the rim and the edge of the pan. The distance between the rim and the edge is different for each pan.



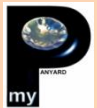
Holes

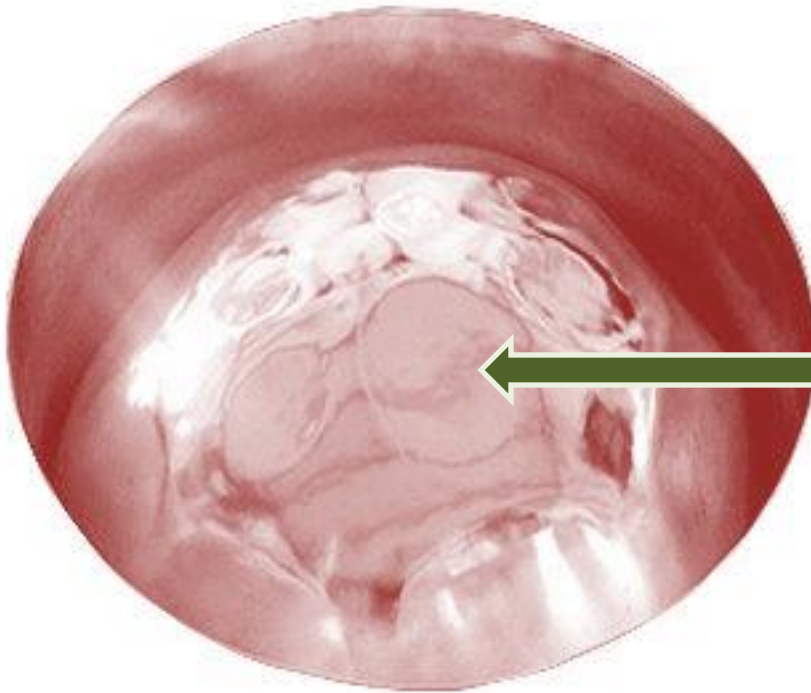
The holes are made at either side of the pan.

They are threaded with string to hold the pans on stands
